INTRODUCTION

NEWSLETTER: Richard Goodman

He would be followed by Al Sagarese in 2025. Joe Porcelli and Al Sagarese recommended that MS Publisher be dropped since it is more powerful than ACCCE needs, plus the software is complex to use and relatively expensive. Steve Duerr maintains a list of those who have paid for the ads. Richard is happy to organize and supply a WORD document of all the articles, the proposed schedule of events and confer with Steve on whose ads are to be included. Lori Powers will take the WORD docs and put it into the overall format, including all the ads, the logo, etc.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE CHAIRS

FINANCE: Steve Duerr

Bookkeeping is reconciled to bank statements through 1/16/23. No bills have been paid because no bills have been received. All expected ads have been paid. There remains 5 members who have not paid their dues. If their \$375 dues are paid, then our income will be very close to our budgeted expenses. Should the \$375/each not be paid, then our income will be only \$500 less than our budgeted expenses. Steve was on holiday at the time of the meeting and subsequently provided this input.

MEMBERSHIP: Heather Wahab

Heather was not present; therefore, Al Sagarese has outlined a few initial thoughts.

- 1] Ask those at the meeting to provide Lori Powers [our admin person] with at least 3 to 10+ names and emails so that we can ask them to join ACCCE.
- 2] There would be no membership costs for 12 months. We ask only a \$25 fee to add their profiles on the website.
- 3] We would come up with 'reasons' for joining and benefits of belonging to a 100-year-old organization [e.g., collaborating on projects, giving talks to the membership, etc.]

Dick Schauer has done a great job. He has moved on and is helping Heather in her transition.

LINKED-IN: Marvin deTar

The ACCCE Linked-In site is getting some attention. Linked-In runs analytics on the number of times the website is contacted by other Linked-In users. This past month there were 17 desktop visitors and 2 mobile visitors. Also, this month 95 contacts to the website were made. I will
